

Linking remains the simplest way to provide access to Library digital collections.

For materials available in the [Library catalogue](#): locate the resource you want to link to and select the title to open the full record. Next, under *Action Links* on the right side, click *Permalink*. Copy and paste the *Permanent Link* to Blackboard to provide a durable, persistent link for the desired resource for your students to read, listen, or watch.

Not all library collections are discoverable through the Library catalogue. For resources that aren't: use the *Find by Citation* tool. From the Library's home page, click *Find Resources* at the top of the page. Select *Find by Citation*.
